In every issue, we feature a religious recognition that ADULTS can earn! This month we feature the *Bronze Pelican*.

The Bronze Pelican is a diocesan recognition given to adults who have made a significant and outstanding contribution to the spiritual development of Catholic youth in any Scouting program. It may be presented to any adult, Scouter or non-Scouter, a member of the laity or religious, or a member of another faith in recognition of consistent

support of the Scouting program. Recipients must be exemplary adults and members in good standing in their respective positions in Scouting and in their faith communities and have the approval of their pastor before the recognition is given. # **Eucharistic Adoration**



Eucharistic Adoration is when Jesus, in the form of the Consecrated Host, is placed inside the Monstrance in a clear window for us to see. Jesus is seen in the form of a white host, a white circle, in the clear window at the center of the Monstrance. It is a special time of prayer before the Eucharistic presence of Jesus. Adoration is showing that we know God is truly God, our Savior, and the

creator of everything that exists.

Requirements to complete this activity are different for each age group, and are available for 1st grade through adult. <u>Here</u> is a link for more information. A beautiful 3 inch patch is available upon completion of this recognition.

## This Issue's Featured Youth Recognition: Pillars of Faith



**Pillars of Faith: Duty to God** is awarded to those members of the Boy Scouts of America who have earned all four of the Catholic Religious emblems: *Light of Christ, Parvuli Dei, Ad Altare Dei,* and *Pope Pius XII.* The recognition consists of a golden pin which can be worn on the Scout uniform or as a lapel pin on non-Scout clothing. This is a special recognition and as such it is only awarded once a year, at the Annual Religious Recognitions Mass & Ceremony. Eligible youth should complete pages 2 & 3 of the application before their

21st birthday and forward it to the Joliet Diocese Catholic Committee on Scouting at the address on the application. Click Here for Application.

**Pillars of Faith: Service to God** is awarded to youth in any scouting program who have earned all four of the Catholic Religious medals: *Family of God, I Live My* 

*Faith, Mary, the First Disciple,* and *The Spirit Alive*. The recognition also consists of a golden pin which can be worn on the Scout uniform or as a lapel pin on non-Scout clothing. This is a special recognition and as such it is only awarded once a year, at the Annual Religious Recognitions Mass & Ceremony. Eligible youth should complete pages 2 & 3 of the application before their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday and forward it to the Joliet Diocese Catholic Committee on Scouting at the address on the application. <u>Click Here for Application</u>.

## **Got VIRTUS?**

The compliance requirements for clergy, employees, and volunteers who minister with minors and vulnerable adults in the diocese have undergone some changes, beginning in February 2020. The Diocese of Joliet's Office of Child and Youth Protection has a chart on the diocesan website that spells out the compliance requirements for all who work, minister, and volunteer with minors/vulnerable adults. You can access it <u>here</u>.

Volunteers who work with minors/vulnerable adults require a VIR-TUS account, completion of the Protecting God's Children course, a background check every five years, and review of diocesan policy and standards of behavior.



Volunteer with minors in a repetitive role (includes coaches, scout leaders, and those who minister with minors in religious education and youth ministry) must also take Mandated Reporter Training, review and sign an Acknowledgement of Mandated Reporter Status, and complete a Volunteer Application.

You can check the status of your compliance by logging into your personal account on the VIRTUS website. Please take time to ensure that you are in compliance with all diocesan requirements when volunteering at JDCCS events or helping scouts earn their religious recognitions.
