Scouts Recognized at Mass and Annual JDCCS Religious Recognitions Ceremony



Scouts and scout leaders from around the Joliet Diocese gathered on April 26 at St. Francis of Assisi Church in Bolingbrook for the Annual Religious Recognition Mass and Ceremony of the Joliet Diocese Catholic Committee on Scouting (JDCCS). This year, 27 scouts from Scouts BSA and the Girl Scouts of the USA Scouts on the were at the Mass to be honored for receiving their Catholic religious recognitions. They represented a sample of the 83 Catholic scouts from around the diocese who had earned their religious recognitions since last year's Mass.

Before beginning the award ceremony, the Most Reverent R. Daniel Conlon, Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of Joliet, celebrated a Mass with the help



of scouts serving as lectors and servers. At the ly followed, Bishop Conlon presented certificates to the scouts who had earned religious

awards. They included the Girl Scouts who had earned a God is Love, Family of God, I Live My Faith, Marian Medal, or Spirit Alive award. One Girl Scout, Abigail White from the Cathedral of St. Raymond in Joliet, was presented with the special Pillars of FaithService award for receiving all four of the Catholic awards available to Girl Scouts.

Bishop Conlon also presented certificates to the scouts from Scouts BSA who had earned their Light of Christ, Parvuli Dei, Ad Altare Dei, and Pope Pius XII emblems. One Boy Scout, Lorenzo Bonk from the Cathedral of St. Raymond's in Joliet, received the special Pillars of Faith-Duty to God award for completing all four of the religious recognitions available to Scouts BSA members.

Adults in the Catholic scouting program were also honored, including Bishop Conlon who was presented with the National Duty to God Award from the National Catholic Committee on Scouting (NCCS) on

behalf of his service to Catholic Boy local and national level. The recognition was well earned, as Bishop Conlon is the USCCB Liaison to the



National Catholic Committee on Scouting (NCCS), a role he continues to hold. He has also led 10-day St. George Treks at Philmont, guiding the scouts in disawards ceremony cerning religious life. He has served as the Catholic which immediate- chaplain, and as a member of Diocesan Catholic Committees on Scouting in the dioceses he has served, as well as serving on the board of four scouting councils. He currently serves as an Assistant Scoutmaster at the St. Joseph Parish in Manhattan, Illinois. He is a member of the Order of the Arrow, a recipient of both the Silver Beaver and the Silver St. George awards, and a great ambassador for Catholic scouting and the Catholic Church.



Other adult awards presented at the ceremony included the St. Anne Medal, which went to Fr. Stephen Eickhoff of St. Liborius in Steger for his service to scouts through the JDCCS events. Three other scout leaders were honored with the Bronze Pelican award which is a service recognition from the JDCCS. They were Esmeralda Bonk and Angelique Minett from the Cathedral of St. Raymond's in Joliet and Stephanie Quigley from St. Joseph in Bradley. Alan Berkey of Our Mother of Good Counsel in Homer Glen received the St. George Emblem, a national award, for his service to the Catholic scouting program over the years.

Finally, two Scouts BSA troops, Troop 300B and 300G from St. Patrick Catholic Church from Kankakee, received the Pope Paul VI National Catholic Unit Excellence Award. The award is given to scout units who meet specific requirements in the areas of adult leadership, service, and earning religious recognitions. The JDCCS was also pleased to announce that they had earned the Quality Diocese Award for their good work on behalf of scouting for the eleventh year in a row.

The JDCCS is thankful to St. Francis of Assisi for hosting our event and to our diocesan liaison for their support in making this another great year of helping scouts earn their religious awards. Got VIRTUS?

The compliance requirements for clergy, employees, and volunteers who minister with minors and vulnerable adults in the diocese have undergone some changes, beginning in February 2020. The Diocese of Joliet's Office of Child and Youth Protection has a chart on the diocesan website that spells out the compliance requirements for all who work, minister, and volunteer with minors/vulnerable adults. You can access it here.

Volunteers who work with minors/vulnerable adults require a VIR-TUS account, completion of the Protecting God's Children course, a background check every five years, and review of diocesan policy and standards of behavior.



Volunteer with minors in a repetitive role (includes coaches, scout leaders, and those who minister with minors in religious education and youth ministry) must also take Mandated Reporter Training, review and sign an Acknowledgement of Mandated Reporter Status, and complete a Volunteer Application.

You can check the status of your compliance by logging into your personal account on the VIRTUS website. Please take time to ensure that you are in compliance with all diocesan requirements when volunteering at JDCCS events or helping scouts earn their religious recognitions.
