With masks, social distancing, temperature checks and a very sanitary environment, the Joliet Diocese Catholic Committee on Scouting (JDCCS) was able to hold our 2021 Day of Recollection in person on Saturday, February 27 from 9am-12pm. Our theme was "Helping Others" and being Jesus' presence in the world, and the event was held at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Parish in Darien.

Nearly 50 adults, volunteers, and scouts attended for a day of presentations and prayer. Father Stephen Borello, Diocese of Joliet Director of Vocations, and Father Josh Miller from St. Charles Borromeo Parish in Bensenville were the presenters for the day and spoke to the older Scouts and answered Q&A about how to bring the light of Christ's love into their lives. Meanwhile, JDCCS Committee Chair Bill Doody and his wife Donna gave a presentation and led discussions with the younger scouts on the events planned by the JDCCS especially same theme.

In every issue, we feature a religious recognition scouts can earn! This month we present to you the *Parvuli Dei* emblem!

The purpose of the *Parvuli Dei* (Children


of God) emblem is to help young boys and girls in the Cub Scout Program of Boy Scouts of America explore a wide range of activities in order to discover the presence of God in their daily lives as members of their families and parishes, and also to develop a good, positive self-image through the contributions they can make to the group or community.

All registered Cub Scouts ages 8 to 10

(Bear or Webelos/AOL) of the Catholic Faith are invited to participate. Each scout will need their own copy of the *Parvuli Dei Activity Book*, purchased online through the National Catholic Committee on Scouting's <u>online store</u>, or through your local BSA service center.

Cub Scouts work directly with their par-

ents to complete this emblem and the activities should be spread out over several weeks. Upon completion, the Cub will review their work with their parish priest and send



their completed form to the Joliet Diocese Catholic Committee on Scouting. More information can be found here.

In every issue, we feature a religious recognition ADULTS can earn! This month we present to you the *Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Medal*.


This recognition was established to allow dioceses to recognize adults whose dedicated work helps youth develop their spiritual lives. It is to honor those who serve the youth through organizations serving girls.

Qualified candidates should be the of excellent character and exemplary in every way and currently active and have served three years with the organization (ideally, registered members).

There are no national restrictions regarding recipients. Awards may be given to clergy, religious, non-Catholics, lay men or women. But recipients should be exemplary Catholics, with the support of their parish community and their respective pastors. The Human Dignity Faith Series activity patch helps us to
learn more about our neighbors, and in doing so, love

This patch includes activities in each of the following categories: Respect for the Individual, Respect for People of all Races and Ethnicities, Respect for People with Developmental Challenges, Respect for People with Mental Health Challeng-

es, Respect for the Unborn, and Respect for the Elderly.

BSA Scouting in the Catholic Church Conference at Philmont



Boy Scouts of America adult leaders are invited to attend the 2021 *Scouting in the Catholic Church* training conference sponsored by the National Catholic Committee on Scouting (NCCS). The course will be held at the Philmont Training Center near Cimarron, NM, from July 18-24, 2021.

Designed for any adult interested in using Scouting to help support Catholic youth ministry, the conference is especially appropriate for Scout chaplains, clergy, diocesan and par-

ish youth ministers, and council, diocesan, regional and national Catholic committee leadership and members. The goals of the conference are to help participants understand how Scouting is Catholic youth ministry, gain knowledge about Catholic Scouting resources and use the information in the course to promote Catholic Scouting in their home dioceses and councils. All this happens in a context of learning, fellowship and fun!

Family members are welcome to accompany course participants. The Philmont Training Center has programs for participants of all ages for a reasonable additional charge. The facilities are clean and include bunks with mattresses and electricity. All participants will

have time to explore Philmont and the surrounding area in the evenings and Wednesday afternoon.
